

## GLCHA SHOW PRODUCER GUIDELINES

To be afforded the privilege of producing a GLCHA approved show, potential Show producers should consider the following recommendations concerning animal welfare.

1. All cattle used during the event should have an average pen weight of 1000 lbs. or less (verified by weigh slips)
2. All cattle should be provided with clean, unlimited water for drinking at all times. Appropriate feed should also be available.
3. All cattle will be penned in areas with solid footing free of excessive mud/manure.
4. All cattle should have fly control provided and used.
5. All cattle should have adequate ventilation and pen space necessary to provide reasonable comfort as related to generally acceptable cattle welfare and care practices.
6. In the case of extreme weather events (heat related temps and humidity) **GLCHA may, at their sole discretion, pull GLCHA approval at any time before, or during the show** should the comfort and care of the cattle fail to conform to the generally accepted practices associated with cattle management and welfare. This includes, but not limited to, fans, water cooling devices such as sprinklers, shade coverings, etc. to ensure the safety and well-being of all cattle.
7. Any cattle that appear to be physically stressed or in distress should be removed from the working area immediately in accordance with NCHA policy.

Designated GLCHA Board members shall have the authority to identify problematic situations and take appropriate action. These members will have the authority to address show managers before/during/after show events and to address concerns regarding animal welfare. They will have the ability and authority to withdraw GLCHA approval of the show at their sole discretion.

In return for this approval, a \$3.00 per approved class entry shall be paid to GLCHA and collected at the conclusion of each approved show.
